The church has in it's own way changed and all around the world people are writing beautiful liturgies and prayers to help us worship God. Sometimes it's hard to find your own words, other times it seems so easy the words flow. Prayer is one thing more people are turning to. Whilst our online offerings are only reaching 70% of our normal congregations our patrons have said today that numbers show that 50% of the people watching or engaging with the church online are new. Whilst we don't want to loose contact with any of our regular worshippers it is encouraging that we are finding new people turning to pray and engaging with us.

I find it heartening that people are finding the church online and joining us. I've also heard that people seem to like being able to worship at a time that suits them—which you are also able to do online. So whilst there has been enforced changes that some of us would maybe not have thought a good idea—it does seem to have opened doors to new possibilities of how we may worship and engage with each other in the future—taking the good from both hopefully and being church for different people in many ways.

Praying at times of crisis, coming together as communities and people of faith is hugely important and we can't forget that although lockdown seems to be being released for some of us, for others it is a frightening time due to their health and they are still in lockdown. Also for some it is frightening due to their mental health or just fears that we're being released too early. I hope we remember to include everyone in our prayers. I'm always conscious that funeral directors are missed out on lists of key workers—I'm never sure if its because of the job they do (and we don't wish to be reminded about death) or if we just forget! Please do include them in your prayers as they also have had a busy time and still are.

For the doctors, we pray, for the nurses, we pray, for the technicians and the janitors and the aides and the caregivers, we pray, for the researchers and theorists, the epidemiologists and investigators, for those who are sick, and those who are grieving, we pray, for all who are affected, all around the world... we pray for safety, for health, for wholeness.

May we feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked and house those without homes; may we walk with those who feel they are alone, and may we do all that we can to heal the sick in spite of the epidemic, in spite of the fear.

Help us, O God, that we might help each other.

In the love of the Creator, in the name of the Healer, in the life of the Holy Spirit that is in all and with all, we pray.

May it be so.


How long, Lord, for how long, must we live in exile and watch the sufferings of the poor?

How long must we keep silent when our bones cry out for justice for the vulnerable and weak?


How long must we wait for equality, for privilege to be overthrown for the sake of the common good?




Broadway Flower and Horticultural Show 2 mins • •



Prayers for the Kingdom


Lord of the new kingdom, of a world of justice, of health and of hope, prepare our minds to see what we might do to shape that new world which is before us.
